We hope you will enjoy browsing through our latest catalogue and come to discover the delights of planting and tasting fresh healthy fruit from your own garden. The mystery of purchasing shop bought fruit will disappear as you will now know what sprays, chemicals and fertilisers have been applied to the food you eat.

To ensure a wide selection of trees, we order from a number of different suppliers. Therefore, the availability of stock listed in this catalogue is subject to delivery from our suppliers.

We will notify customers as their orders are filled and unless prior arrangements are made, we require all orders to be collected by the end of July. This will ensure that customers receive their trees in prime condition.

Whilst Chandlers Nursery will take every possible precaution to ensure that the trees we sell are true to name and label, we cannot be held responsible for errors outside our control. We will replace wrongly labelled trees where possible or substitute where necessary, providing proof of purchase is presented. We advise you to pre-order to ensure your selection is available. Please do not hesitate to contact us if you have any queries.

PLANTING AND CARE

The site of planting should be well prepared prior to planting. Dig a hole roughly double the size of the root ball and mix compost or manure with the existing soil. We recommend Chandlers Organic Compost for planting. Water in well with Seasol and firm the soil gently. Seasol stimulates root growth and minimises transplant shock. This is especially important as a lot of our fruit trees are ground grown and are dug up when dormant. Continue Seasol fortnightly until the beginning of spring. This will improve drought hardiness of your tree. For people in drier areas, it would be advisable to plant fruit trees with water storage crystals or Seasol Planting Gel.

Spring is the time to mulch around your fruit trees, ensuring to leave a gap around the trunk. This helps retain moisture in the soil and prevents competitive weeds from sprouting. Our dry summers can make it hard for fruit trees to establish and we suggest several deep soakings a week either using an automatic system, or by hand. Increase this to 3-4 times a week in very hot weather.

Pests and diseases can also hinder the establishment of your new fruit trees. We offer spray programs for the most common pests and diseases which are available in store or on our website.

A good keeping multi-purpose apple. Mid-season maturity.

Long keeping, popular for dessert and cooking. A late-season apple.

An excellent early-season apple with red and green skin. Juicy and sweet.

LADY IN THE SNOW

A small, white fleshed, sweet apple. Late-season maturity.

PINK LADY

Crisp and juicy with white flesh under red blushed skin. An excellent keeper with late-season maturity.

RED FUJI

Crisp and juicy with excellent flavour. A good keeper with late-season maturity.

STURMER PIPPIN

Bright-green becoming yellow, flushed with red. Good keeper. Used for cooking & cider. Late-season.

WILLIAMS

Also known as the Bartlett pear, large fruit with smooth skin and excellent flavour. Early maturity.

WINTER COLE

Medium sized fruit with rich sweet flesh that stores well. A late-season variety.

MARIPOSA

A mid-season blood plum with dark-red skin and red, juicy flesh.

SANTA ROSA

Partially self-fertile. Purplish-crimson skin with juicy, yellow, red-blushed flesh. Mid-season maturity.

A mid-season blood plum with excellent large fruit and juicy, dark-red flesh.

NUT TREES

ALMOND \$29.95

Self-pollinating, soft shell variety with sweet kernels. An early season cropper.

CHESTNUT \$54.95

APRIL GOLD

Early variety with extra-large dark-coloured nuts.

EMERALD GEM:

Large, tan-coloured nuts. Very prolific.

GEORGE SANDS

Large to extra-large, dark-brown nuts. Thin shelled.

Note. Two different varieties of chestnut are required for pollination.

AMERICAN WHITE

Prolific crop of large, sweet nuts.

BARCELONA

Heavy crops of delicious nuts.

COSFORD

Heavy bearing, thin nuts. Good pollinator.

WANLESS PRIDE

Strong crop of excellent flavour.

Note. Two different varieties of hazelnut are required for pollination.

WALNUT \$99.00

CHANDLER

Heavy producer of large well-sealed nuts.

FRANQUETTE

Late fruiting with medium to large nuts.

WILSON WONDER SEEDLING \$59.95

Seedling walnut variety. Can take many years to produce a crop and fruit is not guaranteed to be of a certain size, quality or flavour.

DWARF FRUIT TREES

DWARF ALMOND \$49.95

BALLERINA APPLES \$56.95

Columnar trees perfect for pots or small gardens. Approximate height is 3.5m x .7m wide.

CHARLOTTE

A green apple with a red blush. Crisp and juicy. Matures mid-season.

MAYPOLE

Dark-red crab apple. Excellent for crab apple jelly. Mid-season

WALTZ

Red-skinned, juicy, good eating variety. Mid-season.

DWARF APPLES \$28.95

Approximate height is 2.5m x 2.5m wide. See previous apple section for pollination unless mentioned.

COX'S ORANGE PIPPIN

Excellent dessert apple. Well flavoured, crisp and juicy.

GOLDEN DELICIOUS

Good keeping multi-purpose apple. Mid-season.

JONAGOLD

Large, sweet fruit with thin blush-crimson skin. Mid-season. Pollinated by Red Fuji, Gala and Granny Smith.

RED FUJI

Crisp and juicy with excellent flavour. Keeps well. Late-Season.

PINK LADY

Crisp, juicy, white flesh under red blushed skin. Late-season.

DWARF APRICOT \$49.95

Approximate height is 2m x 2m wide.

MOORPARK

Large fruit with an excellent, rich flavour. Mid-season maturity.

TREVATT

Heavy bearer of large, juicy, firm fruit. Mid-season maturity.

DWARF CHERRY \$49.95

LAPINS

Large, tasty, dark-red fruit produced late in the season.

DWARF NECTARINE \$49.95

Approximate height is 2m x 2m wide.

FANTASIA

Juicy, yellow, fleshed freestone variety. Crops mid-season

FLAVOURTOP

Large fruit with sweet, firm, yellow flesh. Freestone and crops mid-season.

GOLDMINE

Popular, old favourite. Large fruit with white, juicy flesh. Freestone and mid-season maturity.

DWARF PEACH \$49.95

Approximate height is 2m x 2m wide.

ANZAC

Excellent, early, white peach. Tasty and juicy. Freestone.

GOLDEN QUEEN

Juicy yellow-fleshed clingstone peach. Excellent for eating and preserving. Late-season maturity.

PEACHARINE

A peach and nectarine cross. Juicy, yellow-fleshed freestone variety. Mid to late season maturity.

DWARF PLUM \$49.95

COES GOLDEN DROP

A greenish-yellow plum with a juicy, rich, sweet flavour. Late season maturity.

KING BILLY

Large plum with dark-purple skin and sweet, juicy flesh.

DWARF PLUMCOT \$49.95

SPRING SATIN

A hybrid between a plum and an apricot. The fruit has the appearance of a dark plum whilst the flesh is reddish-yellow.

TRIXZIE DWARF TREES - \$56.95

CHERRY

Approximate height is 2.5m x 2.5m wide.

BLACK CHEREE

Deep-red flesh that is firm and juicy. Self-pollinating.

NECTARINE

Approximate height is 1.5m x 1.5m wide.

NECTAZEE

Medium-sized fruit with sweet yellow flesh. Suitable for a pot.

PEACH

Approximate height is 1.5m x 1.5m wide.

PIXZEE

Sweet yellow-fleshed fruit. Medium-sized fruit. Suitable for a pot.

PEAR

Approximate height is 1.5m x 1.5m wide.

PYVERT

Slightly rounded, green-skinned, full size pear. Self-pollinating.

CUMQUAT

GREEN CUMQUAT

Evergreen, medium shrub producing small round fruit that can be used for marmalade or liqueurs.

MYRTIFOLIA

Highly ornamental, upright growth habit. Yellow to orange fruit.

NAGAMI

Slow-growing variety with sweet oval shaped fruit.

VARIEGATED

Variegated foliage. Young fruit bears white stripes that turn orange when ripe.

GRAPEFRUIT

WHEENY

Best variety for cooler climates. Large fruit with very good flavour. Very juicy.

LEMONS

EUREKA

Grows to 3 metres producing good crops of large lemons. Mostly thornless.

LISBON

Very similar to above but carries thorns.

MEYER

The most popular home garden variety. Smaller fruit with a pale orange tinge. Prolific bearing tree to 2.5 metres.

LIMES

TAHITIAN

Medium-sized fruit with a thin rind. Green to pale yellow at maturity. Grows approximately 2 metres tall.

KAFFIR

Aromatic, citrus flavoured leaves that are used in Asian cooking.

NATIVE LIMES \$69.95

Available in 20cm pots.

FINGER

Also known as "Lime Caviar". Effervescent, tangy flavour. Recently popularised as a gourmet garnish.

BLOOD RED CENTRE

A cross between a finger lime and an acid mandarin. Blood-red rind, flesh and juice.

RAINFOREST PEARL

Green fruit, tinged with crimson, with pink flesh.

MANDARINS

EMPEROR

Requires a warm, sheltered position for best results. Good flavoured fruit produced from May to July.

JAPANESE SEEDLESS

A delicious seedless variety that has loose skin and is easy to peel. The most cold-hardy of all citrus. Perfect for cold climates as it has a low heat requirement for ripening of fruit.

ORANGES

WASHINGTON NAVEL

An excellent seedless eating orange.

BLOOD

Sweet, juicy orange with red flesh. Needs a warm, protected position.

VALENCIA

Sweet fruit, that is very good for eating and juicing.

TANGELOS

MINNEOLA

Grapefruit / Mandarin hybrid. Orange skin with a sharp, rich citrus flavour. Peels like a mandarin and the centre is very juicy.

AVOCADO \$89.00

Hass and Bacon varieties. Both are well suited to our climate. 250mm pot.

BLACKBERRY \$14.95

Thornless non-invasive variety.

BOYSENBERRY \$14.95

Cross between a raspberry and blackberry.

CURRANTS \$14.95

Black, red, and white varieties.

GOOSEBERRY \$14.95

Captivator, thornless variety.

KIWI FRUIT \$22.95

Require both a male and a female plant for fruit.

LOGANBERRY \$14.95

Trailing thornless bramble with dark red berries.

LOQUAT \$59.95

Bessell Brown. Best cool weather variety. 250mm pot.

MEDLAR \$49.95

Dutch variety. Small, astringent, pear-shaped fruit. Pleasantly acidic when fully ripe.

MULBERRY \$89.95

Black English variety. Vigorous tree with delicious black berries.

OLIVE

Kalamata variety in a 250mm pot size for \$59.95. Also available in 200mm pot size for \$39.95. Other varieties are available upon request.

PERSIMMON \$89.00

FUYU

A non-astringent variety. Fruit can be eaten from the tree.

DAI DAI MARU

A popular astringent variety.

POMEGRANATE \$36.95

Mollar de Elche variety. A good cultivar for juicing or fresh fruit.

QUINCE \$28.95

CHAMPION

Large, golden-yellow pear-shaped fruit.

SMYRNA

Large, pale-yellow, sweet flavour.

RHUBARB \$5.95

Giant Victoria variety. Excellent red-stemmed variety. Sold loose as crowns.

RASPBERRY

Raspberries are sold bagged like our fruit trees. Each bag contains a bundle of 10 large canes for \$21.95.
